A first-person narrative chapter book written by Claire Kamber and illustrated by Dale Newman. Ling and her grandpa spend lots of time together. She misses him a lot when she moves away.

Comprehension strategy focus

Making Inferences: Inferential comprehension: answering questions based on clues in the text. Good readers think as they read. They ask and answer questions to help them focus and to build better understanding. Good readers look for clues in the text to help them make inferences. Looking for key words in the questions and in the text will help students find the right answers.

The two worksheets for this lesson reinforce inferential comprehension skills by asking students to make inferences.

Online objectives

Students will:

- Predict actions and outcomes
- Understand the meaning of words
- Interpret character feelings
- Use context clues to understand complex vocabulary

Apply their knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes (morphology and etymology) to understand the meaning of new words

Reading—Comprehension

- *Dictionary:* understands the meaning of these **focus words:** bamboo (noun), born (verb), cage (noun), means (verb), spent (verb).
- Pictures Have Feelings Too: interprets character feelings.
- Words in Context: uses context clues to understand this complex vocabulary: moved, spent.
- *Read the Extract: Songbird* (pp. 2–5).
- Comprehension Quiz
- Map book *Lighthouse Lucy, Chapter 3: The Tangled Squid* is unlocked.

Online assessment

- Students complete a 10 question comprehension quiz. The quiz tests literal, inferential, vocabulary and usage, text analysis and critical literacy comprehension skills. Example questions are:
 - How old is Ling when she is telling the story?
 - What is the likely reason that Ling's Australian friends call her Lily?
 - Which word is opposite of friend?

Additional writing response

Pretend you are the girl in the story. Write a letter to Grandpa in China, telling him about Australia.
